## Marvellous Maps!

Whilst half of our year group were exploring Boggle Hole and Whitby, back at school we have been improving our map reading skills. We learnt to give grid references to find a location on an Ordnance Survey map. We used our previous knowledge of map keys to identify a location and then give the 4 figure and 6 figure grid references to identify our location specifically.

In Science, we have been diving into our new topic 'Living things and their habitats'. We played a game where we had to identify the animal we were by asking our partner questions, and then we learned about the life cycle of some different animals.
